ASA119 Marine Weather Endorsement utilizes the textbook, Modern Marine Weather, by David Burch. There is also a Problems workbook and Weather trainer software that is included and mailed out when students sign up for the class. Students are encouraged to read the first two chapters as minimum and hopefully the entire textbook prior to the class. The first two days are primarily lecture and workshop covering weather related topics. The class then breaks up for two weeks to allow students time to prepare for the test by utilizing the workbook and weather trainer software. Day three is a review and students then take the test.

The textbook covers many weather related topics including ocean passage making. Although the highlights of weather related to ocean passage making will be covered, the focus of this class will be weather patterns of primary interest to inland or near coastal sailors who might expect to be sailing in the Chesapeake Bay, Martha's Vineyard, Block Island, British Virgin Islands and similar waters.
